Calibrate Your Screen

K-D RAP has been validated for a standardized test size therefore calibration of the display is required before use. You can choose to calibrate your screen with either a ruler or a Letter sized (8.5" x 11") sheet of paper.

- 1. Click on "Settings" from the toolbar.
- 2. Select to "Use Ruler" or "Use Letter Page".
- 3. Hold up a ruler or letter page to your computer screen to match the display on the left corner.
- 4. Drag the displayed ruler or letter page image from the right to match the size of your ruler or letter page.
- 5. When the horizontal distance of the 5 inches on the ruler image matches 5 inches on your ruler or the letter page image matches your letter page size, click "Done" to save.



Add a New Student

Administer a King-Devick Test

The King-Devick Test Eye Movement Screening Test will automatically compare test results to age-based performance on speed and accuracy and assist in determining an appropriate beginning K-D RAP practice speed. Administer a King-Devick Test following K-D RAP practice protocol to aid in identifying Students who are still performing below average and may benefit from continued training.

- 1. Select the appropriate Student awaiting King-Devick Test from the Student list.
- 2. Click "King-Devick Test".
- 3. The instructional page appears. Read this in its entirety.
- 4. The test administrator will need a scoresheet to keep track of errors committed by the Student. Scoresheets are available under testing materials.
- 5. Click "Start King-Devick Test" to begin.
- 6. Following the K-D Test, enter the number of errors, tester's initials and any comments. Then click "Confirm".
- 7. The results screen displays the Student's speed and accuracy performance and overall result. Click "Save Test".
- 8. The speedometer is adjusted to the recommended starting speed based on the King-Devick Test performance and the Student is ready to begin practice.

Administer a Quick Assessment

A Quick Assessment assists in determining an appropriate beginning K-D RAP practice speed.

- 1. Select the appropriate Student awaiting quick assessment from the Student list.
- 2. Click "Quick Assessment".
- 3. Read the Quick Assessment instructions carefully.
- 4. For scoresheets, click "Assessment Key" on top Toolbar. Use the Quick Assessment key to keep track of the Students' errors during the test.

K-D RAP Practice

Practice consists of 3 Practice Cards presenting numbers that appear and disappear in a left-to-right, top-to-bottom order. The presentation speed is adjustable.

- Practice Card I: number targets are connected by lines to direct the Student to the next number target
- Practice Card II: guide lines are removed and only number targets are displayed
- Practice Card III shows numbers only and the rows are closer together
- 1. Select the Student from the Student List to display the Student's profile.
- 2. For the first session, the recommended speed (numbers per minute) will be automatically generated and displayed on the speedometer based on the Quick Assessment or King-Devick Test, if completed. Alternately, the starting speed can manually be set if no Quick Assessment or King-Devick Test was performed. When adjusting the speed initially, it may take a couple of practice runs to determine the appropriate speed for the first practice session. Once the K-D RAP Administrator has checked the Practice Accuracy Check box in the Student's profile (See <u>Edit Student</u>), the Practice Accuracy Check feature is now available.

✓ The Practice Accuracy Check feature can be toggled ON or OFF.

- 4. After one practice round, or Practice Cards I-III, select how you would like to proceed then click "Continue".

5. If you have the Practice Accuracy Check feature turned ON, following completion of 1 Practice round or 3 Practice Cards, the estimated accuracy percentage based on the accuracy check results will display. Try to shoot for 100% accuracy before increasing the practice speed.



Practice Protocol

- Randomized, controlled, clinical studies have demonstrated that using the K-D RAP program for <u>20-minute sessions, 3 times per week for 6 weeks</u> significantly improved reading performance in early elementary students. The improvements remained at the longitudinal one-year followup.
- ✓ After 6 weeks, treatment may be continued based on the Student's progress. It may be beneficial for lower performing individuals to continue RAP Practice for more than 6 weeks.
- ✓ Session length: If 20-minute sessions provoke symptoms or are difficult to incorporate into the Student's schedule, consider individualizing the protocol based on Student's symptoms, attention and concentration ability.
 - 5-minute sessions twice per day, 6 days per week
 - 10-minute sessions 6 days per week
 - 15-minute sessions 4 days per week

Practice Instructions

✓ Posture. The Student sits with good posture, approximately arm's length from the screen, with the eyes level at the top of the screen.



- Head Position. During practice, the Student should hold the head still and move the eyes only. Tip: For Students with excessive head movement, place a bean bag on the Student's head for feedback.
- ✓ Rapid Number Naming. Once practice begins, the Student says each number out loud, left-toright, top-to-bottom as quickly and accurately as possible.
- ✓ Adjusting Practice Speed. The goal is to achieve the fastest speed (numbers per minute) with no errors. It may take a few trials to find the ideal practice speed. If the Student is having difficulty keeping up or has excessive errors, adjust to a slower speed. If the Student is able to see and say all numbers presented without difficulty, increase the speed by 5 numbers per minute. 100% accuracy should be achieved for three practice rounds, or nine Practice Cards, before increasing the speed.

Practice Loading

- ✓ Consider adding the following exercises to increase the difficulty of the learning task and capture attention with new training activities. The Student is to continue reading the number targets presented.
- ✓ Techniques to increase attention and difficulty:
 - Number of the day. Pick a 'number of the day' between 0 and 9. Have the Student clap or snap any time he or she says the 'number of the day'. To increase the difficulty, select two 'numbers of the day', and have the Student clap at one number and snap at the other number. For example, the Student claps when calling out the number 5 and snaps for 2.
 - Number memory. Pick a number between 0 and 9. Have the Student remember how many
 of that given number she or he saw in a test card. If this memory task is too difficult, have
 the Student keep track of how many of the given numbers was seen by keeping track using
 finger-counting.
 - **Number replacement.** Replace another word with the 'number of the day'. For example, have the Student say her or his favorite food for the number '0'.
 - Whisper number. The Student calls out all numbers in a normal voice volume except one specified number, which the Student whispers.
 - Mystery speed. After practicing at length at the Student's current speed, change things up, by picking a mystery speed for the Student to try. Have the Student close his or her eyes as to not see the 'mystery speed', then have the Student open their eyes to begin once clicking the Practice button. To increase the difficulty, have the Student guess what the mystery speed is.
 - **Team number**. Pick a number, have the Student give the administrator a 'high five' when the Student identifies or calls out a certain number.

- ✓ You may download the companion K-D RAP Practice App from the iTunes store.
- This is a companion application and available with compatible sized iPads.
- ✓ The K-D RAP Practice App requires an internet connection for initial log in and regular synchronization and is designed for Student level log in and practice.
- ✓ Student's RAP practice using the K-D RAP Practice App automatically syncs with the Student's account, so the administrator will be able to view all K-D RAP practice sessions.

K-D RAP Assessment

Assessments allow the administrator to test and record the Student's accuracy at a specific speed.

- 1. Select the Student from the Student List to display the Student's profile.
- 2. For scoresheets, click 'Assessment Key' on top Toolbar. Use an Assessment Set (A through J, which offer assessment variations in number sequences) to keep track of errors during the assessment.
- 3. Adjust the Speedometer to the desired speed or use the last practiced speed to assess accuracy.
- 4. Click 'Assessment'. Read the instructions carefully.
- 5. You can readjust the speed by clicking 'Slower' or 'Faster'. Instruct the Student to call out the numbers quickly and accurately as they are displayed.
